

2024 FPA Member Survey Summary

A total of 172 members participated in the survey, which is 19.5% of the members polled. Here are the highlights of the findings:

- Over 83% of respondents are satisfied (54%) or very satisfied (29 %) with their FPA member experience.
- The current member benefits are all seen as important with free or low cost continuing education, legislative advocacy, and the online communities/listserv ranking the highest.
- Over 87% of respondents were satisfied (53%) or very satisfied (24%) with the current member benefits.
- Over 94% find FPA's legislative advocacy very valuable (75%) or somewhat valuable (19%). Only 18% always take action when an advocacy alert is issued. About 68% usually or sometimes take action.
- Over 68% of respondents find the effectiveness of FPA's communications far above average (20 %) or above average (48%). Email sent once or several times a week is the preferred method of communication from Central Office.
- FPA CEs remain popular with only 9% rarely or never taking advantage of the offerings. Respondents indicate that the CEs meet their professional needs a great deal or a lot 62% of the time. Offering them remotely or in a hybrid format is preferred.
- Respondents suggested 60 different topics for CE. The most requested topics were: private practice issues (9), mandatories (9), forensic assessment (8), diversity and practice (5), neuropsychology (4), obsessive compulsive disorder (4), and autism spectrum disorder (4).
- Offering the FPA Convention remotely is the preferred option at 41%, but 34% would like to see it held in person, and 10% don't care as they will attend regardless of the format.
- The preferred mode of communication to members is via email, followed by postings in the online community/listserv. Members prefer that they receive emails once a week or a few times a week. A strong 95% indicate they usually or always read the emails sent by FPA. In terms of effectiveness of communication, 67% believe FPA is far above or above average.
- Awareness of FPA's Diversity and Cultural Competence Committee (DCCC) is high at over 86% and respondents would like to see a Diversity Speaker Series and Resource Repository implemented.
